Know all Men by these Presents, That *and*
John Newton, David Sauls & Henry Branson,

are held and firmly bound unto *Witcham, & Burton Esq. Governor Chairman, of the State*
and other Justices of the County Court of *Chatham* in the
sum of *five hundred dollars* to be paid to the *Governor*
said *Chairman*, or his successors in office, or other Justices of the County
of *Chatham* To the which Payment well and truly to be made,
we bind ourselves, our Heirs, Executors and Administrators, jointly and
severally, firmly by these Presents. Sealed with our seals, and dated this
14th day of *February* 1826.

THE Condition of the above Obligation is such, That if the above
bounden *John Newton*

Administrator of all and singular the Goods and Chattels, Rights and
Credits of *Reuben Mitchell* deceased, do make or cause to be
made, a true and perfect Inventory of all and singular the Goods and
Chattels, Rights and Credits of the said deceased, which have or shall
come to the Hands, Knowledge or Possession of the said *John*
Newton or into the Hands or Possession of any Person or
Persons for *him*
and the same so made do exhibit or cause to be exhibited to our said
County Court of *Chatham* within ninety days after the
date of these presents, and the same Goods, Chattels and Credits, and all
other Goods, Chattels and Credits of the said deceased, at the time of his
death, or which at any time hereafter shall come into the Hands or Pos-
session of the said *John Newton* or into the
Hands or Possession of any other Person or Persons for *him*
do well and truly administer according to Law: And
further do make or cause to be made, a true and just account of *his*
said Administration, within the time required by the Act of Assembly
after the date of these presents, and all the rest and residue of the said
Goods, Chattels and Credits, which shall be found remaining in the hands
of, or due from, the said Administrators shall deliver and pay unto such
person or persons respectively, as the same shall become due, pursuant to
the true intent and meaning of the act of Assembly in that case made and
provided. And if it shall appear that any Will or Testament was made
by the deceased, and the Executor or Executors therein named, do exhib-
it the same in Court, making a request to have it allowed and approved
of accordingly, if the said *John Newton*
above bounden, being thereunto required, do render and deliver the said
Letters of Administration, (Approbation of such Testament being first
had and made in the said Court) then this Obligation to be void, other-
wise to remain in full force and virtue.
